





Investing in Our Future: Positive Outcomes of Early Childhood Investments

First Things First (FTF), Arizona's early childhood agency, represents a commitment Arizonans made to our youngest children – that they would have the support they need to start school healthy and ready to succeed. Many young children in Arizona face significant barriers to their success, including poverty, trauma and lack of access to needed resources. In the FTF Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community Region, there are **756 children** (under age 6), with **57% living in poverty**. Here is how FTF is working to support young children and their families in this region.

FTF invests in proven programs, like Quality First, and innovative strategies through grants to community organizations that provide services to children and families.

Regional Key Impact Highlights [State Fiscal Year 2023]

Strengthening Families and Early Literacy

Books were given to families with children birth to age 5 to encourage parent-child interaction and reading.

Adults attended parenting classes to learn about early child care development.



Quality Preschool and Child Care

Early childhood educators received college scholarships to improve their qualifications for working with infants, toddlers and preschoolers.

State Fiscal Year 2023 Total Regional Program Expenditures




